- *Title I PAC/CEP - information put in the system and scores will be put-in as well
- *Digital Citizenship Curriculum - Common Sense Education and [learning.com](https://www.learning.com/) - Many lessons 1st grade 6 units; Common Sense - addresses important topics on safety - (Roblox site - incident on missing child) Linda - it will be a good idea to let parents know about the chatting section to limit kids) Britney is also aware of issue and might have addressed it, and Mr. Ballaguer would have covered it as well. Workshops have been done remote to a late meeting on Zoom; maybe it could be done again in the morning for a zoom meeting and in-person presentation. Mr. Kuan asked regarding the sequence of lessons. Britney is also doing cyber-safety with parents and kids. Maybe she could do a separate presentation
- *SLT meeting format and requirements (see handout for details): we could meet in another room if 108 is not available or library; translators might be needed or have just in case - Mrs. Curry needs to pay for any translator.
- *Cameras are working. Cameras are all around the school: cafeteria, hallways, exits, playground, the auditorium one is difficult to see images; no cameras in the classrooms. Four or two ways cameras in the building; Recordings live in the cloud; principal and security Agent have access; soon AP's will have access; it is only video no audio. Mrs. Curry "So far the cameras have helped with some incidents in the building."
- *Mr. Torpe - shared his experience with Google Classroom during the storm on Jan. 26. The problem was TeachHub and then Google Classroom. It work best going through Zoom and entering ID number and passcode. Mrs. Chung went to Zoom DOE login on the website and sign in.
- *CBT Testing Computer based testing - managed by state and our AP - one time practice for the students to login and testing codes - Teachers have the ability to stop and go - just practice; RALLY: closes simulation to the test practice from the state (now in January); February two practices between practices, the teachers discuss and reteach or move on depending on troubling questions. It has 2 simulations for ELA and two simulations for Math; UNTIMED testing, days Sprinting simulations - teachers will have one simulation test for science - teachers and students work together to see how the test is and the type of questions the students will be presented with. *Mr. Torpe - How do the scores affect the students? The school? Mrs. Curry: Affects the schools and scores stay in their records; The simulation tests do not go in their records. Testing scores impact the school on how many students take the tests and their scores - state funding to school for academic support; high scores -> less money; low scores -> more money; High Performing Impact and Low Performing Impact.

*Mr. Torpe - Lunchtime: retaining a class because of the behavior of some students within a class; Mrs. Curry - I have not been told regarding a class being limited during recess. When the students play too rough, they take a break as a whole class outside. MONITORS from the Fifth grade. Other activities might be brought back to recess due to the ice/snow outside during the next few days - table or floor games, coloring, dancing, etc
